The <u>12th Annual Paul Cormier Memorial Blood Drive</u>, held at St Mary's Church Hall, and sponsored by Knights of Columbus Pine Cone Council 114, collected a new blood drive record, **46 units of blood**! Our cumulative total is 395 units of blood donated! This has potential to save up to 790 lives! Thank-you, so much to the 48 donors, parish office staff, and the many volunteers! Our apologies to those who were not able to donate, for scheduling reasons, but, you can already start signing up for the <u>April 15, 2023 Blood Drive</u>! THANK YOU FOR RESPECTING AND SUPPORTING ALL HUMAN LIVES, FROM CONCEPTION TO NATURAL DEATH.

The Pine Cone Council and Assembly provided 9 Brother Knights to secure donor sign-ups at all the masses the prior week as well as 9 Brother Knights to staff the drive. I was able to recruit a new Knights of Columbus candidate (Tom Lambert) and he has already completed his Form 100 and has been vetted by Monsignor Dubois!

Germaine Cormier, wife of the late Brother Knight Paul Cormier, for whom our memorial blood drive has been named, dropped by to deliver a thank-you card and some superior cookies!

Ben, the American Red Cross blood drive "lead", said that St. Paul the Apostle Parish has a reputation for high productivity blood drives. We have a "very rare" Deferred Donor score of ZERO. We also had an inspirational New Donor percentage of 20%!

All in all, I'd say we had a very successful, very blessed Saturday! Thank-you for demonstrating your love for your neighbor! God bless you, all!



What is the Domestic Church?

The phrase "domestic church" has been used to describe families since the beginning of Christianity. In his *Letter to Families*, Pope St. John Paul II explained, "The Fathers of the Church, in the Christian tradition, have spoken of the



family as a 'domestic church,' a 'little church.'"

The domestic church is believing that how you live your faith in your families, parishes, councils, and community has a ripple effect that changes the world.

It is the council, the family and the parish that knows that everything they do must be based in **<u>surrendering prayer</u>**.

The domestic church deliberately chooses to live contrary to what seems like a Godless world and says, "In our home, council and parish, we **choose to live our faith**."

It is the family and council who prays together, goes to Mass weekly, frequents the Sacrament of Confession and (because they realize they are powerless without God), deliberately avoids that which pollutes their minds and hearts.

Although imperfect, the domestic church is rooted in being humble and joy-filled and rarely preaches the faith because they are too busy living it.



Movie Review, *Mother Teresa: No Greater Love*

It is a rare event when a documentary movie, produced by an insurance company, and released to a limited set of movie theaters for only two nights during the work week grosses over \$1 million, but that is precisely what has happened for *Mother Teresa: No Greater Love.*

Released to public moviegoers on October 3 & 4, 2022, the documentary film tells the life story of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta intercut with stories about the impact of the ongoing work of the religious order which she founded, the Missionaries of Charity.



I saw the movie at the Movie Rocket theater on Odlin Road in Bangor with my eldest son. It was the first film that I saw in-person at a theater since before the Covid-19 pandemic began.

Growing up, I would occasionally

see stories about Mother Teresa in the news and had heard some of the controversies about her rise to sainthood. But, I did not know her whole life story. She, and her order of nuns, seemed incredibly humble and brave while on their quest to follow Christ by serving the very poorest of the poor - no matter where that might be around the world.

The film's story pacing and videography are done very well and combine to create a moving cinematographic experience.
