


### Grand Knight's Column

### Life Committee Report

Thank you, Brothers, for all that you do for the people around you, especially the pre-born babies, newly born babies, young parents, and the elderly! You are right... We don't usually know, for sure, what the results of our efforts are, but GOD KNOWS... and, that's good enough for me!

Please continue to thank God for the June 24, 2022 overturning of Roe V Wade! Thank-you, God, for all the Knights who helped make the Jan 20, 2023, 50th Annual National March for Life the most successful march ever!

Do you remember that our Assembly and Council donated \$600 to Waterville Council 13486, to assist in their fundraising to purchase a new ultrasound unit for Waterville's First Choice Pregnancy Resource Center, approximately 4 months ago. I looked at our Supreme website and found this program quote that supports our donation: "Through **ASAP** (Aid and Support After Pregnancy), for every \$500 a council or assembly donates to a qualifying non-profit pregnancy resource center or maternity home, the Supreme Council will issue a \$100 grant to the same qualifying organization." Our Supreme Council clearly prioritizes the Culture of Life!

In 2021, Knights donated \$4.6 million and 469,000 volunteer hours to support pregnancy centers and the women and children they serve through cash donations and community service activities such as baby and maternity item drives. **Hey,** is it time for us to start another fundraiser to support our Bangor First Step Pregnancy Resource Center? I will investigate the **ASAP** program a bit more, and see how we can raise community awareness about support for life, and support for First Step! Search kofc.org/ASAP



Thanks for the 50/50 crew!!!!


Oh, and thank you to our musicians for their humor, fun, laughter and sweet sounding music. Loved it!!

# Book Review, Cold-Case Christianity, For Kids

One of my hobbies is reading (when I get a few spare moments!) Christian and Catholic apologetics materials. Apologetics is the study of defending religious beliefs. Many early Christian writers engaged in this kind of writing, and the field of study continues today.

I've volunteered over the years as a Catechist for a wide range of ages, from Pre-Kindergarten through High School. The kids all have great levels of faith. They love Jesus. But, being kids, they have questions and want to know that what they believe is actually true. My interest in apologetics has helped guide them through these kinds of questions.



One of the more interesting books that I've read for these kinds of questions is Cold-Case Christianity, For Kids by former cold-case homicide detective J. Warner Wallace. The book (though not explicitly Catholic) follows a group of Detective Cadets working on the mystery of the old skateboard as they learn skills like gathering evidence,

spotting the truth, and understanding what a "reasonable doubt" actually is. In each chapter, the cadets apply the new skills to thinking about the Gospel and the story of the Resurrection.

Mr. Wallace also publishes an adult version of the material, but this Young Adult book is a fast read, teaches the same skills, and could be very accessible to the young people in your life as we enter the Lenten and Easter seasons. During this time of the year, our minds naturally think more about Christ's Passion, and this book can help us all think about it more clearly.
