Elections Can Have Consequences

During the presidential election campaign in 2016, candidate Donald Trump made promises concerning the protection of unborn children. Several of the promises have already been kept:

(1) Leading pro-life groups are delighted that President Trump on January 23rd signed an Executive Order defunding International Planned Parenthood. This Order, called the Mexico City policy, simply requires that foreign organizations as a condition of receiving U.S. grants agree not to perform or promote abortion. The Order was originally made by President Reagan in 1984 and continued by the Bushes, but killed by presidents Clinton and Obama. When Trump's press secretary, Sean Spicer was asked about the order by the press, he said Trump "wants to stand up for all Americans, including the unborn."

(2) President Trump's nominee to the U.S. Supreme Court, Neil Gorsuch, was confirmed by the Senate on April 11th over Democrat and proabortion opposition. During his campaign for president, Trump promised to appoint pro-life justices to the Supreme Court. The Gorsuch appointment is viewed as keeping that promise.

(3) On April 13th, President Trump signed legislation allowing the States to defund Planned Parenthood. This action undoes President Obama's parting gift to the abortion industry requiring the states to fund Planned Parenthood.

There are more promises to be kept including: the defunding of federal funds for Planned Parenthood and reallocating those funds to community health centers; prohibiting abortion after 20 weeks of pregnancy by federal law; and continuing the future nomination of pro-life justices to the U.S. Supreme Court in hope of overturning the Court's 1973 decision, Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion in the United States.


