



#### Campaign for People with Special Needs Concludes

The 2023 Campaign for People with Special Needs has concluded. Congratulations and a great big thank you to the 37 brother knights and 12 family members who volunteered their time. A special thank you to Lexi, Catie and Gabe Hikel, Teddy and Patrick Crocker, Leigh Anne Florey, and Joe Bergin.

Anticipating being at Sam's Club and returning to Mardens, I ordered 20 cases of Tootsie Rolls. When notified that we would no longer be able to solicit at those locations, panic began to consume me!

How would we ever be able to collect enough to make our customary contributions to Penobscot Area Special Olympics, Levinson Center, Camp CaPella, and Pine Tree Camp?

Inquiries to Broadway Hannaford's and Main Street Shaw's, met with no success. Hannaford's did donate a \$25 gift card. Last year I had asked Robin at Dysart's if she did the scheduling at the Broadway location, and she did. My prayers were being answered, we now had the churches along with the Cold Brook and Broadway Dysart's locations. During the campaign we distributed 13 cases of Tootsie Rolls. One case was taken to All Saints School for Principal Johanna Lake to distribute at her discretion. Boxes were sold at the Council and Assembly meetings and a couple of brothers found inventive ways to distribute Tootsie Rolls and solicit donations. At this point I only have about 3 cases remaining – they'll be stored until next year unless there are requests for a box or more.

Weather is always a concern and for the most part we were blessed with very dry and comfortable days. The one exception, Hurricane Lee, forced us to cancel our Saturday at Broadway Dysart's on September 16th.

This has been the year of creative fund-raising initiatives. As mentioned, we had a \$25 Hannaford gift card and we needed a way to maximize that \$25: how about having a raffle at the September meeting? The brothers bought \$100 worth of tickets and Fr. Murray drew the winning ticket which happened to be his own. John Newcomb asked for some boxes to solicit bowlers during league play during the week. He also went to businesses who donated items for the Godparent's Home Bowl-a-thon. He got a \$50 check from Chases' Family Restaurant, earrings from Central Maine Harley (\$60 value), a gift card from Angelo's Pizzeria (\$30 value), and a car wash from Hermon EZ Mart (\$18). Another raffle for the earrings, gift card, and car wash was held at the October Council meeting and raised \$125. Fr. Murray drew the tickets: car wash to Jeff Schaller, pizza to Paul Lavesque, and earrings to Jim Pickard. Including the raffle, John's efforts contributed \$716 to the campaign. Joe Pickering must also be recognized for selling boxes to his friends and neighbors. He has raised \$215 and still has some pending transactions. Thank you to John and Joe!

There are still some boxes to deliver and donations to collect, but after the \$400 expense of paying for the Tootsie Rolls, we have raised \$6,895 to distribute to organizations supporting People with Special Needs. Of the total, 80% or \$5,516 will be distributed locally and \$1,379 will be distributed by the State Council. At the November meeting a motion will be proposed for distribution of the local funds. At this point, the approximate distribution should be \$1,930 to Penobscot Special Olympics, \$1,380 to Elizabeth Levinson Center, and \$1,103 to Pine Tree Camp, and Camp CaPella.

Thank you and God Bless you to everyone who volunteered time and/or made donations to this year's Campaign for People with Special Needs.

OK, truth be told, we have this 'very friendly' competition going on every month of which church brings in more food, but the bottom line always is there is unbelievable generosity from all of our parishioners, and that every ounce of food is desperately needed in this community. As a council we didn't have a working plan in place for a successful distribution network at that time, but a number of generous B Knights jumped on this offer anyway with the idea that I would find the distribution network. I reached out to her about our Coats-to-Kids program and she has told me that she would love to help in the distribution network since she already has the contacts in all of the schools in the community. As a little side note, if you get a chance, stop by the Hall at St. Mary's and take a look at the number of tables full of shoes, socks, backpacks, and other goods that will be sent out to the children in our community.
