Donations are collected after Mass and dropped off at the Brewer Food Pantry on Mondays or Wednesdays from 10 am - 1 pm. Typical weight of these donated goods is usually less than 100 lbs.

Also, the Council was contacted by the Bangor Area Homeless Shelter. They are in urgent need for a volunteer with a full-size pick up (or van) to pick up donated food from the Good Shepherd Food Bank in Hampden every 2 nd Wednesday of the month at 10 am. As far as work details, there have been very few projects so far this summer. ### Annual Campaign for People with Special Needs

Scheduling for our 2023 Campaign for People with Special Needs, commonly known as "The Tootsie Roll Drive" is beginning. Reminder, this campaign benefits Penobscot Area Special Olympics, Elizabeth Levinson Center, Camp CaPella, and Pine Tree Camp.

Since 2020, COVID-19, presented us with difficulties that we were able to overcome. But this year is presenting us with a different problem. Last year, Marden's did not allow any solicitations due to continued concerns from COVID. This year their company policy changed to not allow any solicitations at their stores. This year, when requesting dates at Sam's, I was informed that their new corporate policy is to only allow "a few national programs" to solicit. The Knights of Columbus is not one of them.

The result, at this time, is that our Campaign for People with Special Needs will be conducted at Dysart's and the parish churches. We will be conducting the campaign at both the Broadway and Coldbrook Dysart locations. We will begin the campaign at the Broadway Dysart's location from September 15th through 17th . The campaign at the St. Paul the Apostle churches will be September 23rd and 24th, after each mass. The Coldbrook Dysart's campaign will be from September 29th through October 1st . I will be contacting Bangor Shaw's on Main St., Bangor Hannaford's on Broadway and the Brewer Hannaford to ask to be permitted to solicit for the campaign. If permitted, I will only schedule two of those options and will send emails asking for volunteers.

Having two people for each hour is ideal. This can be two brothers, or a brother and spouse and/or children. Having a brother share an hour with you has several benefits: an opportunity to learn more about each other, help pass the time during slow periods, and ensure contacts with more patrons during busy periods. Having a new brother with one who has been a council member for a longer period can help learn about our council.



Be on the lookout for emails requesting volunteers and act early to reserve your preferred one or two hours. Filling all the time slots early will limit the number of emails I need to send pleading to fill open time slots. # **Pray for Armenians**

120,000 Christian Armenians are currently trapped, without food or medicine, behind a blockade of the Nagorno-Karabakh region maintained by the Muslim-majority nation of Azerbaijan with backing from Turkey. This situation has been going on for 8 months and has reached a critical point.

Armenia was the first country to adopt Christianity as a state religion in 301 A.D. and over 90% of the population remains faithful 1,700 years later. Armenians have suffered tremendous persecution over the years. Most notably, between 600,000 and 1.2 million were killed during the Armenian genocide perpetrated by the Ottoman Empire during WWI.
